- **Recommendation Form**
 - You will be prompted to give the name and email address of a faculty member, staff member, current or former employer, or community representative who is familiar with your leadership ability, civic engagement, and academic achievement. We respectfully request that you refrain from asking family members, peers, or any staff/supervisors directly involved in the selection process for a recommendation.

Your application will only be considered complete when ALL REQUIREMENTS are submitted. As long as your application is turned in by the date and time indicated above (even if we are still waiting for your recommendation), your application will be reviewed. However, we cannot consider the application complete until we have received your recommendation.

Once this portion of your application is complete and has been successfully submitted, you will receive an automatic email confirmation for your records.

If you do not receive an email with "Completed: SHJ Scholarship application 2017-2018" in the subject line after submission, then we have not received your application.

Important Notes for Completing Your Application Online:

We recommend that you review the PDF version of the application prior to completing the online form. Some students find it useful to compose the questions in a Word document before entering them into the application. Community Service Scholar:

Program Description: The Community Service Scholar (CSS) scholarship program is a service-based scholarship designed to expose IUPUI scholars to social issues in the Indianapolis community and show how community agencies are addressing those social issues.

CSS scholars are matched with a community agency and serve four hours each week at the assigned community agency. While there, the scholar participates in programs and activities that further the mission of the agency while addressing the social issue. All Community Service Scholars enroll in the same service learning course during the fall semester that allows them to reflect and discuss their individual service experiences in the context of academic research and findings about service. During the spring semester, CSS's collaborate to coordinate César Chávez Day of Service.

Fugate

Fugate Scholar:

Program Description: The Fugate Scholarship began in October of 2006 in honor of the late Daniel Fugate, a Near West community and public school advocate, as part of a larger Learning Communities Initiative at George Washington Community High School (GWCHS). Fugate Scholars implement various college preparatory curricula to students in grades 5-12 at GWCHS and neighborhood elementary schools.

Fugate Scholars committing to service at GWCHS must be available at least one weekday (or a combination of days) from 7:30 am to 2:30 pm. Fugate Scholars committing to service at one of the elementary schools must be available at least one weekday (or a combination of days) from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm.

Fugate Scholars will be required to attend monthly training sessions and conduct **6 hours per week** of service during the entire academic year. Service hours will begin with mandatory orientation and training in late August.
